## **\*WSSA Give Back**



In 2012, the Western Social Science Association revitalized our organizational mission of service at the Annual Conference in Houston, by hosting a fund drive for a local charity. Conference attendees gave generously and we were extremely pleased to raise more than \$2,100 for the Houston Food Bank. The following year (Denver 2013), we raised \$2,671 for the Food Bank of the Rockies. In 2014, we collected \$2070 for Roadrunner Food Bank of New Mexico. In Portland in 2015, it was \$2,500! In 2016, in Reno, we had our most successful venture yet: \$3000 for the Food Bank of Northern Nevada!

Your donation is tax deductible and receipts will be available at the donation table, along with information about hunger in San Francisco and Marin County and the types of programs offered by the food bank.

The San Francisco-Marin Food Bank (http://www.sfmfoodbank.org) is dedicated to eradicating food insecurity by helping individuals and their communities increase self-sufficiency and food security status. However, with unemployment rates and food, gas, and housing prices remaining high, demand for their services has increased every year. More than **47 million pounds of food** will be delivered throughout San Francisco and Marin in 2016, with more than half of it fresh produce direct from the farm! This means that **100,000 meals** worth of food will be distributed each and every day! Your \$1 will buy 3 meals!

## WSSA 2017 Spotlight on Local Organization

#### The Healthy Southeast Coalition

We are very happy to introduce our 2017 WSSA Spotlight Organization, the Healthy Southeast Coalition (Coalition), to our members and friends. For the last 10 years, Coalition members and partners have worked together to advance healthy eating and active living in the Bayview Hunters Point area of San Francisco.

At its onset, the Coalition did not have any formal outside funding. Rather, the early work of SEFA was supported by time and energy contributed by staff members of the San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH) and the energy of community members. In the Coalition's early work, three pillars of work were articulated to advance healthy eating and active living in the region– better access to healthy food, awareness and education of nutrition issues, and the development of urban agriculture resources by which residents of BVHP could grow their own food. Coalition partners have been very successful in this work; outcomes of their efforts include a municipal ordinance that established a framework to support conversions of small corner stores into healthy food outlets, and an ordinance that required healthy choices as part of fast food "happy meals."

We extend a warm welcome to Coalition members, and a warm invitation to WSSA members and friends to visit with partners of the Healthy Southeast Coalition that will be joining us in San Francisco for the 2017 WSSA conference. We hope to see you there!



## WORKSHOPTeaching Social and Behavioral Science for Health2Professionals: New Opportunities for Social Scientists

In recent years, we have witnessed an increasing emphasis on social and behavioral sciences in medical, nursing, and allied health education. The MCAT, for example, now includes social and behavioral science as one of its four key sections, and medical schools and other health training curricula across the country are increasingly listing such courses among their prerequisites. This presents notable challenges and opportunities for social and behavioral scientists and others studying and working in areas germane to health and health care. We must explore how to shape the content of our existing courses (or new courses dedicated to these student populations) to meet the needs of increasing numbers of pre-professional students pursuing a variety of clinic-based occupations. Moreover, it is an opportunity to explore new pedagogical frameworks so that this important material makes a significant and lasting impact on future health professionals and their work. In this workshop, Wasserman and Hinote explore these challenges and introduce novel pedagogical strategies to facilitate insights on customizing the ways that we introduce social and behavioral science content to students from applied health and medical contexts.

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
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
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
